The Danube River has ranked among the world's most impressive waterways—following the passage of Roman legions, crusading knights, the indomitable lanissaries of the Ottomans and the proud Hussars of the Habsburgs. Our 13-day journey through this storied region includes a 9-night river cruise and two nights in Romania's vibrant capital city of Bucharest. Watch history unfold as we cruise through seven countries with visits to five capital cities and excursions that take you deep into the rich culture of the nations that have emerged and continue to define Eastern Europe. From the UNESCO World Heritage Sites of Budapest to Hungary's fabled puszta to the young territories of Serbia and eastern Croatia, palaces and castles tell the story of independence and pride. Watch in wonder as we cruise through the dramatic Iron Gates that divide the Carpathian and Balkan Mountains on our way to the ancient land of Bulgaria. HARVESTING
RED GOLD

How the red pepper known as paprika made its way to Hungary

centuries ago is often the subject of debate. Some trace the origins of this now-famous Hungarian spice to Portugal. Others say it was the influence of the Turks. One thing historians widely agree on, however, is that Spanish explorer Christopher Columbus brought the fiery pepper plant back to Europe from his travels to central Mexico in the late 15th century. Today, Hungary is one of the world's largest producers of paprika, cultivating and harvesting the pepper into a sweet, red velvety spice. You will likely taste paprika in almost every traditional Hungarian dish you sample on this journey along the Danube. Learn more about the unique history of this spice when visiting medieval Kalocsa, which built its first paprika mill in the 19th century. You may also see imagery of the red pepper plants in local fabrics and art, as it has become a proud symbol of Hungarian heritage.



The Route of Emperors and Kings







The legendary Danube River is a powerful symbol of the diverse cultures and epic narratives of Central Europe. Fifth-century B.C. philosopher Herodotus declared it "the greatest of all rivers which we know" when Greeks traveled from the Black Sea through the naturally carved Iron Gates. The land was ruled by the Roman, Ottoman, and Byzantine Empires, creating intriguing capital cities along its banks. A channel for commerce, culture, and conquest, the Danube links the heartland of Central Europe with nations beyond the Black Sea. Our cruise through this fascinating region takes us to seven of the 10 countries where the mighty Danube flows— Austria, Slovakia, Hungary, Croatia, Serbia, Bulgaria, and Romania. The history and culture of these nations continue to inspire musicians, writers, artists, and travelers from all over the world.

13-DAY/12-NIGHT ITINERARY

Depart Home City Day 1

Depart your home city for your flight to Vienna, Austria.

Vienna, Austria Day 2

Arrive the next day in the capital city of Vienna, where you will embark the AMADEUS SILVER III. Attend the Captain's Welcome Reception and Dinner this the evening. (R,D)

Vienna/ Bratislava, Slovakia Day 3

In Bratislava, enjoy a walking tour of the Old Town. See the Gothic 14th-century St. Martin's Cathedral and the elaborate Primate's Palace, a breathtaking 18th century landmark. Stroll through St. Michael's Gate, the only remaining portion of the city's medieval fortifications. (B,L,D)

Budapest, Hungary Day 4

Start the day on the Buda side of the river to see Castle Hill and visit St. Matthias Church and the Fisherman's Bastion. In Pest, see the Parliament Building, the second largest in Europe. At UNESCO-inscribed Heroes' Square, admire monuments honoring Magyar chiefs who established the Kingdom of Hungary. Along Andrássy Avenue, see the Hungarian State Opera House and the Chain Bridge that links Pest to Buda. (B,L,D)

Kalocsa Day 5

Enjoy a scenic drive through Hungary's protected *puszta* and visit a farm to see a performance of Hungarian horsemanship. Learn about the history of paprika on your way to Kalocsa, where you will visit the Folk Art House and the Bishop's Palace. (B,L,D)

Vukovar, Croatia/ Novi Sad, Serbia Day 6

In Vukovar, see 18th-century
Eltz Manor and the iconic
GRAND HOTEL, famously
purchased by the city's
Labor Movement in 1919.
Visit the Baroque Church
of Saints Philip and James.
Enjoy a walking tour of
Novi Sad's Old Town to see
the Name of Mary Church,
Town Hall, and the 17th-century
Petrovaradin Fortress,
nicknamed the "Gibraltar of
the Danube." (B,L,D)

Belgrade Day 7

Embark on a tour of Belgrade, featuring Terazije Square and Temple of St. Sava. Visit Kalemegdan Fortress and the famous "House of Flowers" museum dedicated to former Yugoslavia's leader, Josip Broz Tito. (B,L,D)







Donji Milanovac/ Iron Gates Day 8

Visit Lepenski Vir archeological site and museum to see the impressive exhibition center of Paleolithic artifacts.

Later, enjoy spectacular views of the Danube Gorge and cruise past the Iron Gates.

Nikopol, Bulgaria for Arbanasi and Veliko Tarnovo/Ruse Day 9

Visit Arbanasi's perfectly preserved Konstantsaliev House, a unique, fortress-like structure originally built at the end of the 17th century and reconstructed several times—today serving as an ethnographic museum. The next stop will be a visit to the Church of the Nativity before continuing to the city of Veliko Tarnovo, one of Bulgaria's oldest settlements.

Explore the historical center of this "City of the Tsars" and see the 12th-century Tsarevets Fortress. (B,L,D)

Constanța, Romania Day 10

In Constanta Old Town, see the poet Ovid's statue in Ovidiu Square, the Great Mahmudiye Mosque and the Orthodox Cathedral of Saints Peter and Paul. Enjoy a Captain's Farewell Reception on board this evening. (B,L,R,D)

Feteşti/ Bucharest, Romania/ Disembark river boat Day 11

Your land tour in Bucharest begins with a tour of the city that includes lunch at a local restaurant and a visit to the immense Palace of Parliament, the world's second largest administrative building. Check in to the INTERCONTINENTAL ATHÉNÉE PALACE BUCHAREST. (B,L)

Bucharest Day 12

Today you will visit the National Museum of Art of Romania, located in the Royal Palace in Revolution Square, and the National Village Museum. The largest of its kind in Europe, this open-air ethnographic museum features a collection of 50 buildings representing the history and design of Romania's rural architecture. Enjoy a farewell reception at the hotel this evening. (B,R)

Bucharest/Return to Home City Day 13

Check out of the hotel and transfer to the airport for a flight back to your home city. (B)
